In one of my next articles I will have to tell San Mateo residents that your 3 year, \$53M project has achieved **exactly zero new bus shelters**.

Do you want to comment on that fact? Would you mind answering a few more questions about this subject while we are at it?

- Why is the project so far behind schedule?
- Is there actually a schedule?
- How come this is the first time - in 50 years - the district took inventory of all its shelters and stops?
- Why does a very basic business need like bus shelters require an extra project in the first place?
- Why isn't there a yearly budget dedicated to year-round shelter installations and maintenance?
- The presentations showed different numbers. At the very end of this project how many bus shelters can we expect for the \$53M?
- So far SamTrans has installed 0 shelters and maybe 5 benches. Have you achieved any of the other upgrades in terms of posted schedules, shade structures, digital schedule, garbage bins, etc.?
