Re: Distributing Transit Rescue Funds For Immediate Use

Dear Chair Pedroza and Commissioners:

As elected officials in the Bay Area, we write to urge you to allocate \$1.67 billion in American Rescue Plan (ARP) transit funds for immediate use.

Congress has apportioned to Bay Area transit agencies a generous stimulus package to hire workers and restore service, and we are disappointed to learn that MTC is not planning to adopt an allocation of these funds until late July. The transit agencies in our districts need to budget these funds now in order to plan to hire workers, fund operations, and restore service in the fiscal year that begins July 1. As mid-pandemic stimulus funding, it should be distributed immediately to stimulate our local economies by hiring workers and taking shoppers and diners to their destinations to spend money in our communities.

We strongly oppose MTC's positioning itself as a gatekeeper over when our transit agencies can access their shares of this crucial funding. MTC's statement that it is "playing the long game" contradicts the explicit purpose of these funds: to recover transit operations from the pandemic and stimulate our economies. Currently, thousands of riders are being passed up each day because buses and trains are running reduced schedules. The longer service levels remain reduced, the more likely it is that riders will give up on transit and find permanent alternatives.

Transit is an essential public service that our constituents depend on, especially our low income and Black and Brown constituents, and our elders, students, and disabled. Each day that MTC delays making an allocation of ARP funds, you deny our local transit agency boards, and our transit workers and riders, the chance to plan for a swift recovery of service.

We urge the MTC to allocate (or make a fund estimate of) ARP funds immediately, so that it can be put to immediate use in restoring service and creating good union jobs.

Re: Reimagine SamTrans Input from South San Francisco

Dear Chairperson Stone, Vice Chairperson Ratto, and Members of the Board:

I write to provide input on behalf of the City of South San Francisco concerning the various alternatives presented in *Reimagine SamTrans*. The South San Francisco City Council considered the *Reimagine SamTrans* alternatives at its May 26, 2021, City Council meeting, and gave direct input to SamTrans staff attending the meeting. City Council also gave direction to city staff that written input should be provided as well following a planned outreach event in South San Francisco on June 5, 2021. Based upon that City Council meeting, and the outreach to our residents and businesses concerning the three alternatives, alternative two comes closest to matching desired outcomes. Below, however, are the elements of *Reimagine SamTrans* across all three alternatives which will best serve our residents and businesses:

- 1. Creating shuttle service from the South San Francisco BART station to employment centers located East of Highway 101 (E101) in South San Francisco is critical and of highest priority. The E101 employment area contains the world's largest single cluster of biotechnology companies, with currently 12 million square feet of Research and Development (R&D) facilities in operation and another eight million square feet under construction or in planning. In November, 2021, the large fintech company *Stripe* will relocate its headquarters from San Francisco to E101 in South San Francisco, bringing with it up to 2,000 employees. Plus this area is home to over 3,000 hotel rooms, two Costco stores, an Amazon distribution center, hundreds of non-biotech businesses and tens-of-thousands of jobs. This area is predicted to have the highest job growth in San Mateo County over the next five years. Providing dependable, regular shuttle service from BART is essential.
- 2. Create SamTrans bus service from other points in the county to the employment hubs in the E101 area, for the reasons stated above. E101 workers have been asking for SamTrans bus service, and in particular SamTrans express bus service, for many years.

- 3. Provide connections to the South San Francisco Caltrain Station, currently under construction and slated to have greatly enhanced service under the Caltrain long range plan. A true transit system must provide the connections necessary for riders to seamlessly move from origin to destination, which means facilitating connections between Caltrain, BART and WETA ferry terminals. SamTrans can provide that connection.
- 4. Do not alter Route 292. This route provides service into San Francisco and is essential to many South San Francisco residents who rely on the existing service for work, for school and many other activities.
- 5. Consider keeping and/or adding routes which service late night riders. Many South San Francisco residents work jobs which require late night transportation.
- 6. Avoid reducing routes to schools. Without this service many students or their parents will drive to school, adding vehicles to the already congested commute. Student ridership patterns are predictable and steady, and niche routes should be developed to service this need.
- 7. Support the implementation of Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) along the El Camino Real Corridor, complementing the Grand Boulevard Initiative and providing a more workable commute option along this very busy traffic artery.
- 8. Invest in appealing and safe bus shelters, along with technology enabling riders to track buses and more easily understand bus routes. Waiting for a bus is as much a part of the rider experience as the bus itself. During public outreach, complaints about bus shelters, or the lack of bus shelters, was the number one comment from the public.

I greatly appreciate the outreach conducted by SamTrans staff, which was conducted professionally and thoroughly. The work by Jessica Epstein and her team was very well done and responsive to the requests from our community. In particular, the recent in-person outdoor town hall in our Latinx community was well attended and well received. Thank you for the efforts made to capture the needs and voice of South San Francisco.

We look forward to working with SamTrans staff and the Board as *Reimagine SamTrans* rolls forward. I understand a "final" proposed route schedule will be available in the fall for further public comment. We will work with the SamTrans outreach team at that time to ensure the new plan is thoroughly communicated to our residents and businesses, and that robust public outreach yields the feedback necessary for the Board to make a final decision.

Thank you for your work. It is difficult to meet the needs of all concerned in a financially constrained environment. I hope the points made above will aid in your decision making.
