Dear Senator Feinstein:

On behalf of San Mateo County Transit District (SamTrans), the Peninsula Corridor Joint Powers Board (Caltrain) and all who rely on public transportation, I thank you for providing emergency funding for public transit agencies in the Coronavirus Aid, Resources, and Economic Security (CARES) Act. With your support, California's transit agencies have already received \$3.74 billion in *new* transit funding that has helped us weather the most immediate impacts of the pandemic.

Unfortunately, the financial crisis facing public transit agencies has only grown, and the threat of permanent reductions and elimination of local public transit services loom large without additional financial assistance. Therefore, as you consider the next round of emergency actions to support critical industry, we respectfully urge you to provide at least \$32 billion in new emergency funding to public transit agencies nationwide. Funding should be targeted to those regions/transit operators with the greatest need for resources to protect jobs and maintain service.

Due to the pandemic, Caltrain has experienced a ridership decline of 95 percent and has cut back service to 70 trains per day. Meanwhile, SamTrans has experienced a 75 percent ridership decline as well as service reductions on 31 of 76 of the fixed route service.

The loss of ridership has been catastrophic for Caltrain. Unlike other Bay Area transit systems, Caltrain does not have diversified, dedicated revenue sources. More than 70 percent of its operating costs are covered by fares and other self-generated revenues.

Without additional funding, it could take years for our service to recover from today's crisis, resulting in the elimination of important mobility options for millions of Californians and the unnecessary delay of California's economic recovery.

With that funding, we would be able to continue to provide critical transportation options to the healthcare, public safety, grocery store, and restaurant workers in our communities classified as essential workers during the COVID-19 pandemic. Data shows that these workers – specifically, those riding public transit today – are overwhelmingly low-income and/or people of color who lack access to other mobility options.

Now is the time to invest more in our nation's public transportation infrastructure to support jobs, reconnect Americans, and build the necessary infrastructure network to provide critical public transit services and economic opportunities for all.

On behalf of the Peninsula Corridor Joint Powers Board (Caltrain), the San Mateo County Transit District (SamTrans) and all who rely on public transportation, I write to thank you for providing transit agencies with temporary statutory relief in the June budget.

These relief measures are critical to ensuring transit agencies, like Caltrain and SamTrans, can apply the state funding they already receive toward maintaining transit service as they confront the public health crisis.

Now, as you consider the next round of emergency actions to support critical industry, we respectfully urge you to provide at least \$3.1 billion in new emergency funding to California's transit agencies as part of a larger funding package for the transit industry.

This emergency funding would address critical funding needs at transit agencies statewide to prevent devastating permanent reductions of transit services and ensure public transportation is still a viable option for communities most in need.

Due to the pandemic, Caltrain has experienced a ridership decline of 95 percent and has cut back service to 70 trains per day. Meanwhile, SamTrans has experienced a 75 percent ridership decline as well as service reductions on 31 of 76 of the fixed route service.

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The emergency funding level we are requesting would address the remaining needs of California transit agencies after fully accounting for the investments made by the federal CARES Act and is necessary to prevent further, substantial harm to our service. Without additional funding, it could take years for our service to recover from today's crisis, resulting in the elimination of important mobility options for millions of Californians and the unnecessary delay of California's economic recovery.

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We, of course, understand there are serious and competing needs for limited state resources. However, please consider that additional funding to ensure transit agencies can continue to provide service is critical to a balanced economic recovery, to our quality of life and to achieving our state's ambitious environmental goals.

We, therefore, respectfully ask you and the Governor to prioritize funding for public transit as we work to maintain this essential lifeline service in our communities.
